This email is to confirm that at its most recent meeting, Dartmoor Forest Parish Council voted to OPPOSE this application. The Council commented that: "Any development of this type would be out of character with all the cherished features of the area and be detrimental to the visual amenity. In the event of tree felling or windthrow the whole structure would be visible and both these events have taken place to some extent already. The track to the site will cause damage to natural drainage and both it and the base of the structure will be detrimental to flora and fauna. We consider this to be an inappropriate development for Dartmoor National Park."



This is just a courtesy note to the parish council to let you know that the annual Dartmoor Devil cycle ride will pass through your parish on Sunday 30th October.

Speedwatch Report October 2022

Speedwatch is now fully integrated into the focus for Devon and Cornwall police to half the number of road deaths by 2030 and to wipe out road deaths by 2040.

Currently one person dies as a result of a road traffic collision every 22 minutes.

The accident reduction team has now been upgraded and consists of seven detection vans and six motorbikes also equipped with speed detection cameras.

They now have a capability for low level detection which means they are no longer restricted to operating only during daylight hours but can also function at night, so be warned.

Speedwatch groups will be given a letter of authority which can be shown or given to motorists who question the legality of Speedwatch. We have been told it will clearly state we are operating on behalf of Devon and Cornwall Police.

Interesting fact – When a driver is sent on a driver awareness course a percentage of the cost is given to the police Vision Zero team which can then be used for extra equipment like Vans and motorbikes etc.

Operation Snap – On average 234 submissions a month led to a prosecution, this can range from a fixed penalty fine to fines and points, driver awareness course or a court appearance. These submissions are helping to keep our roads safe.
